Midwives (Amendment) Regulations 1974

Commencement : 30th July 1974

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 18 of the Midwives Decree 1966 (as amended by the Midwives (Amendment) Decree 1971), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Aminu Kano, the Federal Commissioner for Health, hereby make the following regulations :—

1. For Form 5 in the Schedule to the Midwives Regulations 1967, there shall be substituted the Form contained in the Schedule hereunder.
